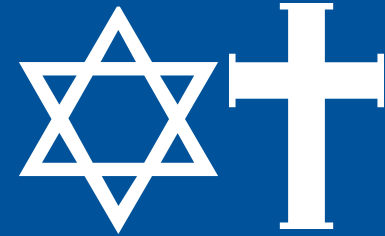



Their discussion will consider biblical texts, views of the Messiah, approaches to social justice and community life, and questions around anti-Semitism and the historic Jewish-Christian relationship.*

## Academy Faculty

**Herbert N. Brockman**, rabbi at Congregation Mishkan Israel, New Haven, Connecticut, is a seventh-generation rabbi. Raised in an Orthodox home, he chose the liberal tradition of Reform Judaism. A graduate of Ohio University, he completed his bachelor's and master's degrees in Hebrew Letters from Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati, and a doctorate from the Ecumenical Institute of St. Mary's Seminary and University of Baltimore. After 25 years in the rabbinate, Rabbi Brockman was awarded the Doctor of Divinity from Hebrew Union College. He teaches at Yale Divinity School and is involved in a number of community projects, particularly those involving interfaith and interracial activities. He previously taught at Goucher College, Muhlenberg College, and Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia.



## Academy Faculty

**Darrell Jodock** is the Drell and Adeline Bernhardson Distinguished Professor of Religion at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minnesota. He teaches Lutheran Studies, Jewish Relations, History of Christian Thought, and



Nineteenth Century theology. He is the recipient of the Danforth Graduate Fellowship and was elected to membership in Phi Beta Kappa. He also has received the Wallenberg Tribute Award for interfaith activity. He serves as chair of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Consultative Panel on Lutheran-Jewish Relations, and previously founded the Institute for Christian-Jewish Understanding at Muhlenberg College in Allentown, Pennsylvania. A graduate of St. Olaf College, he received his M.Div. from Luther Seminary and his Ph.D. from Yale.
